## Music Department

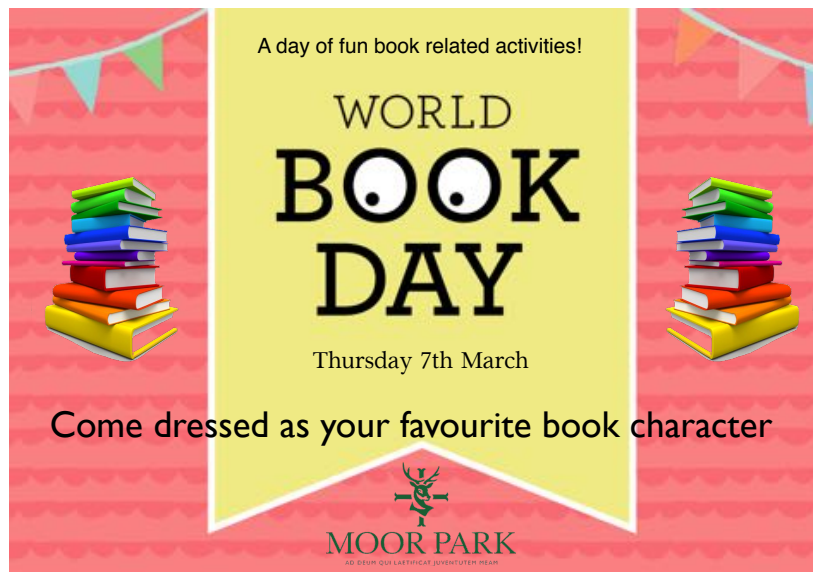
The dates for this term's music exams are as follows:

In both cases the exams are in Hereford. We will transport the pupils there and back.

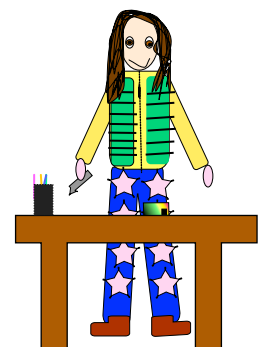
