Year 8 Leavers' Books

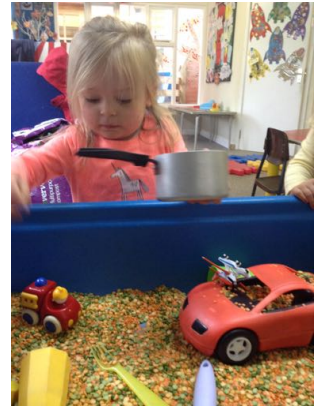
