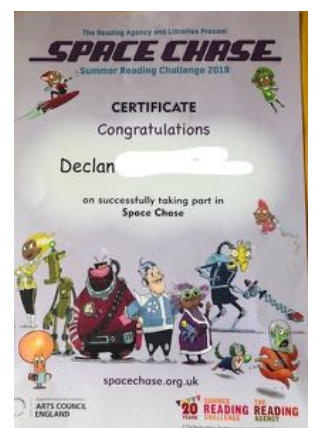
Wrekin Maths Challenge
